Greetings from your President

Wow! Hampshire's performed well at Louisville!

It was great to see many friends and acquaintances at Louisville. And, the best yet, it even snowed! I was amazed as most classes in the Junior Show were very deep with quality and I was sure glad I was not having to place the classes. Congratulations to all the exhibitors.

A lot has changed in my world in the last few months. Mainly, I have become involved with a project that has been nonetheless overwhelming. I was grateful for the registration papers to help me gain most of the knowledge. If you had an animal lose a tag, replace it and write it down. I cannot read your mind on what the number should be. This, I am sure, is what my wife would like to know when I re-tag an animal. Just make sure somehow you can keep your records up to date and it will help someone later.

Tom told me Kurt Overcash, Greg Deakin, and he were all the same age. He took both individuals' deaths very hard. Now, we can add Tom Clayman to the list.

We are all getting older. If something does not seem right, go to the doctor. Do not be afraid to tell them what is happening. They cannot guess if you do not tell them. Do not be so stubborn! This is some advice I also must follow. Tom Clayman was a very dear friend of mine. He is someone I learned and grew from. I will forever be grateful for our friendship and time we shared as we tried to better ourselves. I cannot express how much I will miss him.

I hope lambing season is going well. Please share some moisture with central and western Kansas.

As always, the board appreciates any input or ideas you have. Please feel free to reach out to your director or me. As we progress into the year, I kindly ask you to think of Tom and everything he gave to this industry. It was my great honor to not only call him a colleague, but a friend. I cannot fully express the impact he had on my life..

2023 Howard Wyman Sheep Industry Leadership School Applications Due April 1

The American Lamb Board (ALB) is thrilled to sponsor the 36th Annual National Lamb Feeders Association (NLFA) Howard Wyman Leadership School. The deadline to apply is April 1. This year's event is scheduled for July 9-13 in Columbus, Ohio. Participants will explore the Ohio sheep industry, visiting several lamb producers, feedlots and barns; live processing, ultrasound and discussions about lamb round out the agenda.

The 5-day program offers great information and is designed to highlight a cross-section of the sheep industry, especially for up-and-coming industry leaders.

The school is named for NLFA organizer Howard Wyman and emphasizes the feeding, marketing, harvesting and merchandising of lamb and lamb products.

"The Howard Wyman Leadership School is a great way for young producers to gain valuable production information and to meet other producers, feeders and industry specialists," says ALB Chairman Peter Camino."

Attendees must be at least 20 years of age. The \$250 fee covers lodging, meals and tour expenses. Some individual transportation will be required. Application is free, with the fee due upon acceptance.

The application for this year's school is available on the NLFA website.

ALB is an industry-funded national research, promotion and information checkoff program that works on behalf of all American commercial and seedstock producers, feeders, direct marketers and processors to build awareness and demand for American Lamb. Funding is through mandatory assessments paid by all industry segments. The board is appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture and represents all industry sectors, geographic regions and sizes of production. The work of the ALB is overseen by USDA and supported by staff in Denver, Colorado.

ALB's annual budget averages about \$2.5 million. Almost two-thirds of funds are devoted to American Lamb promotion. By law, the Board's expenditures for administration are limited to 10% or less of projected revenues. The board was established in 2002. More information is at LambResourceCenter.com.

Dr. Stanley Poe was recognized with the Distinguished Producer Award.

Poe has raised Hampshire sheep nearly his entire life as 11 bred ewes arrived on the family farm in 1945. Along with his wife, Carol, the couple raised four sons on the farm. Two of them – Stanley Poe II and Kalen – still work regularly on the place and were back home in Franklin, Ind., to finish lambing the flock's 350 brood ewes.

"I think we're going to be around for a while," Poe told the crowd of sheep producers during the Industry Awards Luncheon at the convention. "Poe Hamps appreciates this greatly. We never gave it any thought about having to stand here and reflect on it. We've now dedicated the farm totally to Hampshire sheep, and it appears it will be that way for some time with these two grandsons coming on."

Poe Hampshires has been a leader in the use of artificial insemination within the American sheep industry. While a veterinarian handles the actual procedure, the family designed and built an on-farm facility that allows for artificial insemination of up to 100 head a day. Through the years, they've grown to providing AI and embryo transplant services for other sheep producers in a handful of states.

For many years, Poe worked off the farm with Elanco Animal Health. Once he retired, he was free to become more

involved in the sheep industry. He's a past president of the Indiana Sheep Association and has regularly represented the state on the ASI Board of Directors.

"Carol and I have transferred the farm and the sheep to our oldest son and his wife," Poe said in Fort Worth. "The second son is with Indiana Farm Bureau and deals in the cattle business. The third son is in Lexington, Kentucky, in government relations. Our fourth son, Kalen, is not far from the farm and works for Kemin Industries in addition to helping Stanley. He started his own flock of Hampshires and does a lot of livestock judging around the country."

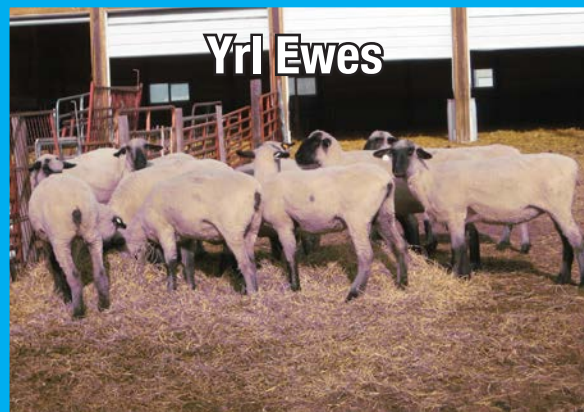

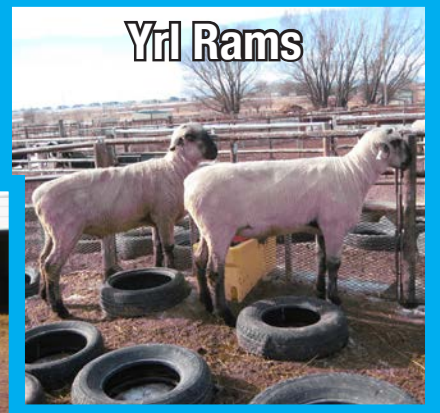

INTRODUCE YOURSELF & YOUR FAMILY

Pleasant Acres Farm (PAF) has been operated by Joe and Beth Clarke since May 1985. Our children, Daniel (Heather), Sarah, Rebecca and Matthew, now all adults, were literally raised alongside our sheep and cattle. From the time they came home from the hospital as newborns, until they graduated high school, our sons and daughters were present during chores, birthing lambs and calves, as well as the endless list of farm work associated with raising livestock.

In addition to raising registered Hampshire sheep and registered Hereford cattle, the Clarks grow corn, soybeans, and alfalfa hay. Also, having raised two daughters, it goes without saying that Joe and Beth still have two horses living out their retirement years.

Beth and Joe were not raised on a farm. In fact, both grew up in a suburban subdivision near Chicago. Shortly after a 1983 wedding, the couple purchased a hobby farm near Crystal Lake in northern Illinois. Joe insisted that their new property needed some chickens so home felt like a farm. Beth and Joe drove around the countryside until they found a livestock farm selling mature hens. At the conclusion of the chicken transaction, the farmer's wife held up a small orphan lamb and said, "Want to buy this too?" Joe said, "Sure", even though he had no idea what to do with a lamb. The deal was done. Unexpectedly,

Beth and Joe were now in the sheep business. Not knowing a thing about raising sheep, Joe suggested a trip to the 1985 McHenry County Fair. Certainly, a visit to the sheep barn could provide some lessons on how to become a shepherd. It was there that Beth and Joe met George England from Cary, Illinois, along with his 4-H aged children Derrick and Max. This trio spent the afternoon explaining the many, many details of sheep production. The Clarks not only walked away with a good beginner's knowledge about sheep, but they were so impressed by the responsibility and maturity shown by the 4-H kids that it was declared, "This is the way we want to raise our children." From then on, Beth and Joe became committed to the agricultural way of life.

DESCRIBE YOUR HAMPSHIRE FLOCK

Over the following few months, several commercial ewes joined the orphan lamb to create a small flock. It was then that a friend, Dr. Jane Richardson, DVM, suggested to Joe that it's best to purchase purebred sheep if one intends to be in the business for many years. A visit was made to Mr. England's farm. Three registered Hampshire ewes were purchased. This became the foundation of the Clarke's Hampshire flock. Some of the sheep on PAF today can be traced back to these original three ewes. Several years passed while the flock size was growing in numbers. Through success and failure, much experience was gained. During lambing season 1992, PAF noticed a high mortality rate amongst the newborn lambs. It appeared the lambs were starving. The entire flock was tested for ovine progressive pneumonia (OPP). The results hit like a ton of bricks. The flock was heavily infected with OPP.

During the spring of 1993, Beth and Joe purchased land and buildings formally used as a working dairy farm. The additional barns permitted the Clarke's, with the assistance of the OPP Society, to orphan and raise the lambs artificially for the next two years. After the lambs became mature sheep, the flock was tested again and again for OPP. All sheep were negative. As a bonus, all sheep also tested negative for caseous lymphadenitis (CL). Since 1994, the flock has been closed on the female side. Only rams were brought in to diversify genetics. Over the years, the Clarks have used rams from Hubbard, Houghton, Pope, Paul, Davis and Roembke.

Good health and longevity are a high priority for the flock. This year, out of 70 brood ewes, 11 animals are eight years of age or older. The oldest ewe is thirteen. Another accomplishment for PAF Hampshires was being recognized as the first flock in the State of Illinois, and the first Hampshire flock in the United States to be "certified scrapie free" by the United States Department of Agriculture.

WHAT ADVICE DO YOU HAVE FOR PEOPLE STARTING OUT IN THE SHEEP BUSINESS?

When asked for advice, Joe recommends to someone starting out in the sheep business to purchase their first ewes from a reputable purebred operation. Start out with healthy animals. This makes being a shepherd so much easier. A second bit of advice is, as an inexperienced sheep owner, expect disappointment. Most new producers assume birthing and rearing lambs is a task mother nature handles without any difficulties. Then the newbie feels devastated when lambs die that first season. Many quit the business then and there. Joe encourages the new producers to use each death to gain experience to prevent a repeat. Soon the new shepherd will recognize a weak or starving lamb, and know how to treat the creature. It's the satisfaction that a person feels upon successfully saving a lamb that gives a new shepherd pride in his/herself, and the reason to keep going!

AHSA Futurity Program

What is it?

A point system for youth to participate in and receive monetary prizes from the American Hampshire Sheep Association when youth show their futurity nominated Hampshires.

- Potentially \$12,000 is awarded in 2023 for 6 divisions
- Divisions: Fitted Raised, Fitted Purchased, Slick Shorn Raised, Slick Shorn Purchased, Slick Shorn Yearling Ewe & Fitted Yearling Ewe
- Animals can only be entered in one division
- Animals nominated for futurity may receive points at any show, including both open and junior divisions
- You can turn in as many point forms as you want but the top 5 highest points will be used to calculate your final total
- A point sheet must be filled out for every show and be turned in by Nov 1 of the current year.
- Point forms can be found on www.hampshires.org
- **The AHSA Board of Directors is putting a renewed focus on the futurity program for 2023!**

The program provides incentive to youth to show their sheep, as well as, recognition to producers for raising high quality animals.

How do I nominate a ewe lamb or yearling ewe for futurity?

- \$25 entry fee per animal OR \$200 one-time fee to nominate the whole lamb crop
- Must fill out nomination form found at www.hampshires.org
- Animals can be nominated through online sales, private treaty, and any public auction

Who can participate in the AHSA Futurity?

- Any junior who is under 21 years of age and has paid the current year's membership dues
- The nominated animals must be in the junior's name as of Sept 1 of the current year
- Only one junior can submit points forms for a specific sheep
- One junior can have multiple animals in the futurity; however, the junior will only receive premiums for two animals

2023 AHSA Futurity Rules

Sponsored by the American Hampshire Sheep Association

Point Scoring:

- A point records form must be filled out for each show and forwarded to the American Hampshire Sheep Association office by November 1, 2023. The form must be signed by the superintendent of the show who must also verify the youth owning the lamb did physically show the animal unless physically impaired. If physically impaired, the junior member must still be present at the show even if they are unable to show their sheep in the show ring.
- At each individual show the ewe may earn futurity points from both the open division show and/or the junior division show only if the shows are held at different times and judged by different judges. Only the junior show placing from the North American International Livestock Exposition will be counted. Futurity ewes can only be shown in breeding class. The ewe lamb and yearling ewe cannot be shown in market classes.
- Futurity yearling ewes and ewe lambs may be shown at an unlimited number of shows and submit points from the shows shown in. Only the top 5-point forms submitted can be used toward the futurity final point totals.
- No designated show will be held before May 1st.
- Futurity awards will be announced during the annual meeting of the American Hampshire Sheep Association. Premiums will be mailed to the winners from the AHSA office after December 1st. Winners will also be posted on the AHSA website.
- There will be separate divisions for slick shorn and fitted ewe lambs. There will also be separate divisions for bred and owned slick shorn and fitted ewe lambs. An individual sheep can only participate in one division.
- The yearling ewe futurity program will continue for 2023. There will be a fitted and slick shorn division in 2023. Until we see how successful the program is, the purchased and bred and owned ewes will compete in their respective slick shorn and fitted category.

Premiums for Purchased Division and Yearling Ewe Division:

A minimum of (\$2,000) will be awarded in premium in both the fitted and slick shorn divisions. The guaranteed money totals will be given as follows:

1 st - \$400 (20%)	6 th - \$175 (8.75%)
2 nd - \$300 (15%)	7 th - \$150 (7.5%)
3 rd - \$250 (12.5%)	8 th - \$15 (6.25%)
4 th - \$225 (11.25%)	9 th - \$100 (5%)
5 th - \$200 (10%)	10 th - \$75 (3.75%)

Premiums for Bred & Owned Division:

1 st - \$300 (30%)
2 nd - \$250 (25%)
3 rd - \$200 (20%)
4 th - \$150 (15%)
5 th - \$100 (10%)

In case of a tie, each animal that is part of the tie will receive the same amount.

Exhibitor Rules:

- Rules of exhibition shall be those published in respective premium books of each show. Ownership deadlines might vary from state to state. All ewe lambs and yearling ewes must be nominated by Sept 1st.
- All juniors who meet the requirements for the Junior Show at the North American Livestock Exhibition are eligible to participate in the Futurity Ewe Lamb and Yearling Ewe program. Rules for the NAILE are:
 - Not to be more than 21 years of age the date of the show in November, no lower age limit but junior member must be physically capable of showing his/her own ship.
 - Junior member must be present to show their own sheep unless physically impaired. If the junior member is physically impaired, the junior member must still be present at the show that the futurity ewe lamb or yearling ewe is being shown at and earning points from even if they are unable to show their own lamb in the show ring.
 - Animals purchased must be transferred through the AHSA office. The date of sale will reflect when the animal was purchased and must be prior to September 1st. No ewe lamb or yearling ewe will be able to earn futurity points prior to being sold and transferred to the junior member or registered in the bred and owned division.
 - Current year paid membership in the American Hampshire Sheep Association is required. Membership must be paid prior to September 1st.
- Juniors are responsible to be knowledgeable of and abide by these rules.
- All ewe lambs and yearling ewes must be purchased and transferred directly to the youth and must be recorded in the AHSA office by the sale management or with a completed 2023 AHSA Futurity Nomination form. For the bred and owned division, the ewe lamb and yearling ewes must be bred by the immediate family or by the junior member. Immediate family is defined as grandparents, parents and siblings of the junior exhibitor. These ewe lambs and yearling ewes can remain in multiple juniors' names but only one junior can submit point forms on each individual animal. If the lamb is transferred out of the youth's name it will NO LONGER be eligible. No partnerships, farm, family, 4-H club or FFA chapter names will be accepted. Also, the purchaser cannot be a family member or family member of an employee of the breeder of the lamb.
- Ownership of ewe lambs and yearling ewes or points earned in the futurity are not transferrable to any other person other than the original owner, nor are the points transferable from one animal to another.
- No futurity entrant may receive premiums for more than two ewe lambs or yearling ewes. Total points earned by two animals cannot be combined to one animal.

Consignor Rules:

- Entries are limited to yearling ewes and fall and spring born ewe lambs.
- Nomination fee is \$25 per ewe lamb or yearling ewe and payable to the AHSA. Fee will be paid to the AHSA office by the breeder of the animal or the junior member who nominated their own animal and must be submitted at the time of the transfer or registration of the lamb. **Breeder nomination fee of the entire 2023 lamb crop can be done by paying a one-time \$200 nomination fee.**
- Each yearling ewe or ewe lamb must conform and abide by the rules and regulations of the individual sale (see below)
 - Yearling Ewes or ewe lambs sold in an online or production or by private treaty can be nominated for the 2023 AHSA futurity program by completing and submitting the 2023 AHSA futurity nomination form along with the nomination fee. Transfers must be completed within three weeks of the sale date.

- Yearling ewes and ewe lambs nominated at public auction managed by Heartland Group, Select Livestock Services, or any other recognized sale management, will be recorded by the sale management at the time of the show and designated with an F brand prior to the sale.
- Junior members may re-nominate yearling ewes that were futurity nominated in 2022 by submitting the AHSA futurity nomination form and paying the \$25 nomination fee.
- The AHSA will not be held responsible for any dispute and or disagreements between buyers and sellers.
- Animals will be permanently identified for futurity purposes and recorded by their individual scrapie tag number and/or flock tag number.

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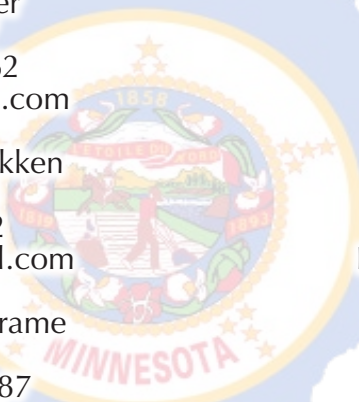
